2016 SPRING BIRD COUNT and BIRDATHON



Please help us to celebrate "International Migratory Day" on Saturday, May 14. We are asking members and friends to spend part of this day enjoying the spring migration by watching birds in their local area or in a nearby natural area.

Chapter leaders will be available in many places to help you in identifying birds, but you may also participate on your own, or by forming your own group.

Our goals are as follows:

- 1. **Identify** as many species as possible in "Greater Bergen County" on that day, and to count HOW MANY birds of each species are present.
- 2. **Report** your bird lists and total number per species to David Hall, who will compile a master list of the total species and number of birds identified.
- 3. **The master list** is the basis for our "Bird-a-thon" fundraiser (see below on how to participate). The more bird species that we identify, the more money BCAS will raise for local conservation and education projects!
- 4. Have fun!! May 14th is THE DAY, rain or shine.

This is the 24nd Annual Spring Bird Count for BCAS! We hope to have leaders covering many areas, including Garret Mountain, DeKorte Park, Tenafly Nature Center, Allendale Celery Farm, Mehrhof Pond, Teaneck Creek, and Mahwah Green Acres. We would be very happy if you join one of the above groups, or you may chose your own favorite local bird spot and send back a list of what you see. This is perhaps the most exciting time in the birding year, and we encourage you to take part.

We will have signup sheets and tally sheets at the BCAS meeting on April 13. Call David Hall (evenings) at 973 -226-7825 (email is david.hall@einstein.yu.edu) to join a group or to volunteer to lead an area. Beginning May 15, call or email David to report your bird list, including the total number of birds per species. We are also ready to send you a tally list by email.

LEGACY OF LEADERSHIP SERIES: BETH GOLDBERG

Beth became hooked on birds about fifteen years ago when she attended a weekend program sponsored by the NJ Div of Fish and Wildlife called "Becoming an Outdoors Woman." She signed up for a workshop on Birdwatching led by Carol and John Knapp. Beth said, "They were wonderful. It was peak of migration and birds were abundant. I was fascinated by the diversity and color of the warblers, scarlet tanagers and indigo buntings. I was hooked."

Growing up, her dad always had bird feeders and houses in the yard. this was her first awareness of birds and nature. Interesting to note she says, "...as my dad got older and less mobile, I set up window feeders and we both enjoyed them. I was happy to bring this enjoyment full circle."

Beth became active in BCAS around 2005. It was primarily focused on bird walks. She always felt welcome and was especially appreciative of the help and patience of more experienced members like Dick Engsberg, Dave Hall and Ken Witkowski who were wonderful mentors.

She served as President, Recording Secretary and Membership Chair. She didn't serve on other birding organizations but was a member of several such as Fyke. Her earliest memorable BCAS walks were at Garret Mountain, but she has always enjoyed the small gems in the local area. Her favorite bird is Pileated Woodpecker.

My twin sister and I are somewhat competitive and she frequently "taunted" me with news of pileated woodpecker sightings in her forested yard in Pennsylvania, invariably, after I had just departed to return home. Her first sighting of this nemesis bird was later at Schiff Nature Preserve in Mendham. In recent years, my sister and I have birded together here and near State College, PA, where a couple years ago, we had the shared pleasure of seeing two pileated woodpeckers. (but I spotted them first!)

BCAS LEGACY OF LEADERSHIP: RUTH COMFORT

Birding filled a special place for Ruth during a difficult time in her life, her mother and sister passed within 3 months of each other and birding became her saving grace.



Living in North Bergen, her intro to nature was in the green area of Hudson County - Braddock Park. Early in her education, she cared about the environment --safe air and water were in the forefront in high school where she joined Ecology and Protection Of Animal Welfare Clubs.

Ruth discovered *real* birding after receiving a pair of binoculars as a birthday gift. Then she subscribed to National Audubon magazine and with it came the Blue Jay newsletter with its listing of local field trips. In the spring of 1989, she went on her first field trip to Oradell Res-

ervoir where she met Ken Witkowski, Harold Feinberg and the late Linn Pierson. It was the first time she used her new binoculars and they were very helpful—as were the BCAS field leaders. "The first time I saw a robin, really saw one I was hooked. They spoke of the meeting at Flat Rock Brook and I decided to go. I am a shy person by nature and this group was very welcoming to this newcomer."

After going on several field trips, Ruth said she was earning a reputation not bringing lunch to Peaquannock watershed, driving her car in a ditch at Raptor Trust/Great Swamp, and losing her tailpipe on the GWB. With these many mishaps she believed people began to remember her and guesses that's why she was asked to be recording secretary. She must have done ok since from recording secretary she moved to editor of the Blue Jay and then became President in 1994. She certainly did earn a reputation of trust and admiration.

BCAS helped her see New Jersey for what it was—incredible ecology from mountains, lakes, swamps, marsh-land and shoreline, all being seen in one day. BCAS was her answer to finding like minds and souls. Her favorite place to bird was the Peaquannock watershed. Living for a few years in West Milford, it was like her backyard. Linn Pierson was her birding buddy and it seemed every weekend they were going somewhere local—DeKorte, north into Passaic, Sussex County, the swamp, and of course High Point. Ruth's hawk interest was because of Linn—spending hours, days counting Hawks at State Line and Mount Peter among others.

With ill health and the loss of her dear friend Linn, Ruth hasn't been active in birding of late. She says, "BUT I still consider myself a birder. I can't watch tv or see a movie without identifying birds. I miss it - maybe someday I can get back as my health improves. I will always be an advocate for the environment. I never miss an opportunity to educate."


Maybe we can see Ruth at our 75th Anniversary Party this year and thank her for her time and effort on behalf of BCAS.
